About the Programme

A new series of Technical Training and Support Events

Further to the successful introduction of the revised TUE Programme for the period from January to June 2010, the Institute's Technical, Training and Support Group is now launching a completely new training programme for the period from June to December 2010 comprising six parts, as follows:

Part I: Technical Update Evenings

The one and a half hour TUE sessions aim to refresh members on updates to the existing standards and to help them better understand the application requirements of the three main areas of professional standards: Financial reporting, Auditing and Ethics. The programme agenda covers all current standards with particular emphasis on those which are of most relevance to SMPs and PAIBs.

Part II: The Revised Code of Ethics

The seminar will introduce members to the Revised Code of Ethics which will be issued in mid-2010 to be effective from 1 January 2011. Practical application guidance on particular independence issues which may cause members difficulties and on how the code may be applied will be addressed in the seminar.

Part III: HKFRS for Private Entities Workshops

The three-day workshops are based largely on IASB produced training materials which will address the application of all sections of the new reporting standard. Practical application guidance will be provided. The workshops will be facilitated in an interactive learning mode which include group break-out exercises and group feedbacks.

Part IV: Auditing and Financial Reporting Forums

External speakers will be invited to speak in these forums on their areas of expertise covering specific topics of interests, newly issued standards, interpretations, exposure drafts and practice notes.

Part V: Audit Practice Manual Application Workshops

The one-day training workshops are developed to refresh SMPs' audit skills in audit risk assessments, and to learn how to navigate the excel based audit programmes contained in the revised Audit Practice Manual, with reference to the Clarified Hong Kong Standards on Auditing. The revised Audit Practice Manual will be issued in the summer of 2010.

Part VI: Training for Audit Staff

The two-day workshops are designed to be a practical instruction to audit staff on planning and undertaking an audit assignment in accordance with professional standards. The workshops will be held in November and/or December 2010. These workshops will link with the use of the new Audit Practice Manual and use relevant case studies as practical application guidance.

Technical Update Evenings

Technical Update Evenings (TUE) is a programme of regular evening training sessions held by the Institute to provide comprehensive training to members to build up knowledge on current financial reporting and auditing issues. In each session, TUE aims to help members explore key areas of complexity within the standards and to increase members' abilities to deal with issues arising from the application of standards and get more knowledge on new topics.

Starting in 2010, duration of each TUE session has been extended from the previous one hour session to the current one and a half hour session.

The programme covers all current standards but puts particular emphasis on those that have been identified as having particular application issues.

The Revised Code of Ethics

Seminar on the revised Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants

The revised IFAC Code of Ethics was issued in 2009. The Institute's Ethics Committee has considered the IFAC Code and will be issuing the Hong Kong equivalent Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants soon with an effective date of 1 January 2011 (same as the international effective date).

The revised Hong Kong Code maintains the principles-based approach supplemented by detailed requirements where necessary, resulting in a Hong Kong Code that is robust but also sufficiently flexible to address the wide-ranging circumstances encountered by professional accountants. Provisions on independence requirements are strengthened.

Additional guidance on the provisions governing acceptance of any payment in an agent-principal relationship under the Prevention of Bribery Ordinance is also covered.



The HKFRS for Private Entities (HKFRS for PEs) is issued with effect from 30 April 2010. Six training sessions will be organized for the purpose of assisting members with the implementation of the new HKFRS for PEs.

This education initiative for the HKFRS for PEs workshops will take place over three days. Each day will be broken down into a number of sessions. Each session will include plenary instruction followed by group break-out exercises and group feedbacks. The agenda of the workshops is based largely on the IASB training materials with practical guidance on application of all sections of the standard.

Training workshops are planned to refresh audit skills in audit risk assessments, and to learn how to navigate the excel based audit programmes contained in the Audit Practice Manual.

Eight sessions will be held to introduce the 27/F, Wu Chung House, Wanchai revamped audit practice manual and the new requirements under the Clarified Hong Kong Standards on Auditing and how they affect audit engagements.
