Examination regulations

Candidates should read the examination regulations carefully. The regulations are published in the **candidate handbook** and examination attendance dockets. Candidates are reminded that breaching the examination regulations may render your script booklets unmarked. Over the past few years, **16** candidates' script booklets were **UNMARKED** as they had violated the examination regulations. The followings are some of the examination regulations that candidates must follow strictly:

- **Examination identification requirement**
Candidates are required to bring examination attendance dockets and Hong Kong identity cards/passports to the examination centre on the day of the examination. In the absence of Hong Kong identity cards/passports, you are required to show student registration cards for identification purposes. If you are unable to produce such identification documents or the identity cannot be satisfactorily verified, you may not be permitted to sit the examination.
- **Use appropriate script booklet**
Candidates are required to use the appropriate script booklet to answer the respective section of the examination paper, i.e. case on the case script booklet, essay/short questions on the essay/short questions script booklet. Failure to do so may render your examination scripts **UNMARKED**.
- **Do not tear the script booklet pages or take away script booklets from the examination hall**
- **Write the question numbers clearly**
- **Do not use pencils**
