About the speaker

Robert Wyld is a Partner in Johnson Winter & Slattery (Sydney). He practices in the area of Commercial Litigation and Dispute Resolution. His work has a particular focus on regulatory investigations and prosecutions, IP litigation, white collar crime and fraud, revenue and taxation disputes, international arbitrations (based in London, New York and Singapore) and the conduct of representative (or class) actions in Australia and overseas. Robert's recent work includes

- representing the Statutory Manager of a charitable trust in the Northern Territory in relation to various claims of improper financial conduct, fraud and breach of fiduciary and trust duties;
- representing 4 former AWB officers before the Cole Inquiry into the AWB/Oil-For-Food wheat contracts with Iraq and subsequent civil litigation and criminal investigations by the Commonwealth Taskforce;
- conducting confidential bribery investigations in Australia, North and South America and South-East Asia for international and Australian companies in the power generation, utilities and construction industries; and
- prosecuting and defending both civil claims and criminal prosecutions in Australia involving tax fraud, money laundering, foreign bribery and conspiracy and claims involving seizure and forfeiture of assets under the *Proceeds of Crime Act 2002* (Cth).

Robert has written numerous papers on banking and securities litigation, the conduct of class actions in Australia, on the detection and managing commercial risks, identifying fraud and the tracing of the proceeds of crime, the AWB role in the UN Oil-For-Food scandal, whistleblower reforms in Australia and Australia's anti-corruption laws for directors and issues across the Asia Pacific Region. He has delivered ethical compliance training seminars to clients in Australia and throughout Asia and is a regular guest speaker at conferences in Australia and overseas. Robert is currently an Asia Pacific Regional Officer and a Co-Vice Chair on the International Bar Association's Anti-Corruption Committee.

Robert

- has written a text on *Australia's Anti-Bribery and Anti-Corruption Review* in *The Anti-Bribery & Corruption Review* (1st Edition published London January 2013 and 2nd Edition published London December 2013);
- was the Australian contributor to *The Anti-Corruption Ethics and Compliance Handbook for Business* published by the World Bank, the OECD and the United Nations Office on Drugs & Crime, November 2013;
- is completing a further text on *Australia's Anti-Corruption Practices* to be published as part of a larger text on *Global Anti-Corruption Practices* in the US in 2014.
