

Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants takes regulatory action against a certified public accountant

(HONG KONG, 13 July 2022) The Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants has taken regulatory action against Mr. Lau Siu Wah, certified public accountant (A31597) for being found guilty of dishonourable conduct.

Mr. Lau was convicted of criminal intimidation under sections 24 and 27 of the Crimes Ordinance (Cap. 200) in December 2020. The conviction was likely to have brought discredit upon Mr. Lau himself, the Institute or the accountancy profession. As a result, he was guilty of dishonourable conduct under section 34(1)(a)(x) of the Professional Accountants Ordinance (Cap. 50).

Regulatory action

Based on the foregoing and in lieu of further proceedings, the Council of the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants concluded that the following should resolve the complaint:

- 1. Mr. Lau acknowledge the facts of the case and his non-compliance with the Professional Accountants Ordinance:
- 2. Mr. Lau be reprimanded; and
- 3. Mr. Lau pay the Institute's costs of HK\$15,000.

About Resolution by Agreement

In order to better serve the interests of the public and the profession, the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants ("HKICPA") ensures complaints are dealt with in an effective and transparent manner. In accordance with Council powers outlined in the Professional Accountants Ordinance, a Resolution by Agreement ("RBA") may be offered in uncontested cases considered to be moderate after taking into account the nature and gravity of the complaint, past disciplinary records of the respondent and any aggravating or mitigating circumstances. An RBA will not be offered in cases involving complaints of dishonesty, which are handled through a separate disciplinary process.

The RBA includes a mandatory public censure which entails publication of the name of the respondent, facts of the case and areas of non-compliance with professional standards.
