Advanced Diploma in Specialist Taxation 2013/2014

The Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants invites applications for admission to its Advanced Diploma in Specialist Taxation 2013/2014. The programme comprises 3 modules: Intermediate China Tax, Advanced Hong Kong Tax and Intermediate International Tax. This is a part-time programme, with workshops to be held on Saturday afternoons and tutorials to be held on weekday evenings. Each module lasts for approximately 3 months. The programme contents are the same as for the 2012 programme. Starting from 2013, a modular approach has been adopted allowing participants the flexibility to complete the 3 modules at their own pace. The first module, Intermediate China Tax, will commence on **16 March 2013**.

All preparatory and contact hours will qualify as verifiable CPD hours for the Institute's members.



Objective of the Programme

This programme will provide participants with an integrated study of different aspects of Hong Kong, China and international taxation, with particular emphasis on the practical issues relating to these areas and the primary principles that underpin them. The programme will enable participants to extend their competence in the field of Hong Kong taxation and to broaden their competence in China and international taxation.

Who is the Advanced Diploma designed for?

Advanced Diploma students will be members of the Institute who want to extend their tax knowledge and practical experience and stretch themselves to become sophisticated tax advisers in an increasingly complex environment.

Learning Outcomes

On completion of the programme, participants should have attained:

- A practical knowledge of the key areas in contemporary taxation practice in Hong Kong.
- An understanding of China taxation law and practice and its application to practical tax computation.
- An ability to analyze Hong Kong and China taxation issues and tax planning, in both local and international business operations.
- A solid foundation of key international tax concepts.
- Practical taxation skills to provide competent tax advice with respect to cross border transactions.

In order to enhance their potential for success in the programme, participants need to commit to studying, obtaining practical experience through their work, and undertaking further reading and research.

Programme Coverage and Structure

The programme consists of 85.5 teaching hours with three modules:

- Advanced Hong Kong Tax, building on the Institute's QP Module D
- Intermediate China Tax, focusing on the major China taxes
- Intermediate International Tax, focusing on the tax law and practice that apply in cross-border trade and investments.

Students' training manuals will be provided.

Participants can take the Advanced Hong Kong Tax and Intermediate China Tax modules in any order. Intermediate International Tax module can only be taken after successfully passing both the Intermediate China Tax and Advanced Hong Kong Tax modules.

Admission Requirements

Individuals who meet the following criteria are eligible for admission to the Advanced Diploma programme:

- 1. HKICPA members, and
- 2. (a) for the Advanced Hong Kong Tax module, existing knowledge of Hong Kong taxation to the level of Module D of the Institute's QP, and
 - (b) for the Intermediate International Tax module, successful completion of both the Intermediate China Tax and Advanced Hong Kong Tax modules.

There is no requirement for existing knowledge of China or international tax to enrol on Advanced Diploma in Specialist Taxation modules.

Priority admission will be given for eligible applicants who enrol and pay for the first 2 modules (i.e. the Intermediate China Tax module and the Advanced Hong Kong Tax module) at the same time.

Practical tax experience is highly desirable for participants to benefit fully from the programme. As places are limited (approximately 72 places for each module) preference may be given to applicants who have practical experience. Preference may also be given to members of the Institute who are members of the Institute's Taxation Faculty.
