Keynote Speaker

Ms Ada Chung

Ms Ada Chung JP Registrar of Companies, Companies Registry

Ms Ada Chung is a FCPA and a barrister. She was appointed as the Registrar of Companies in August 2007 and has since been heavily involved in the rewrite of the Companies Ordinance and the implementation of the new Companies Ordinance. As a representative of the Financial Secretary, Ms Chung is an ex-officio council member of the HKICPA. She also sits on the Financial Reporting Council. Before her appointment as the Registrar, she was a Deputy Law Officer of the Department of Justice.

Mrs Natalia Seng

Mrs Natalia Seng FCIS FCS(PE) is Chief Executive Officer – China & Hong Kong of Tricor Group and an Executive Director of Tricor Services Limited. She leads the strategic development and management of Tricor's operations in China and Hong Kong. Mrs Seng has been in the founding team of the Company Secretarial Practice of EY in Hong Kong for 20 years before the practice is sold to Tricor Group. Her professional practice area covers business advisory, corporate governance, fiduciary services and regulatory compliance.

Mrs Seng is a Chartered Secretary, a Past President and retired Council Member of The Hong Kong Institute of Chartered Secretaries ("HKICS") and a retired Council Member of The Institute of Chartered Secretaries and Administrators in the United Kingdom ("ICSA").

Mrs Seng has been appointed by government as a lay member to the Council of the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants ("HKICPA") from December 2013 to November 2015. She holds a Master's degree in Business Administration (Executive) from City University of Hong Kong.

She is also a Fellow of The Taxation Institute of Hong Kong ("TIHK") and The Hong Kong Institute of Directors ("HKIoD") and an appointed member of the Inland Revenue Department Users Group since 2009.

Mr Ernest Lee

Mr Ernest Lee FCIS FCS(PE) is a Partner of the Professional Practice Department of EY, China. He has over 20 years' experience in auditing and providing technical advice on accounting and auditing related matters in a variety of industries in the Asia-Pacific Area. Mr Lee is a Council Member of the Hong Kong Institute of Chartered Secretaries (the "HKICS"). He is a Vice-Chairman of the Professional Development Committee and the Membership Committee of the HKICS. Mr Lee is also a member of the Financial Reporting Standards Committee of the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants (the "HKICPA"). He has been a member of the Review Panel for the HKICPA's Best Corporate Governance Disclosures Awards since 2003, and was a technical reviewer of the Professional Standards Monitoring Panel of the HKICPA for more than 10 years. He is also a technical reviewer of the Risk-Based Financial Statements Review Programme of the Financial Reporting Council.

Speakers and Panellists

Professor Say Goo

Professor Say H Goo FCIS FCS is Professor and Director of the Faculty's Asian Institute of International Financial Law (AIIFL) and Japan and Korea Programme. He joined HKU in 1995 after five years of teaching at the University of Exeter and the University of East Anglia, England. Over the years, he has taught many subjects including Contract Law, Land Law, Company Law, Insolvency Law and Trust, and Corporate Governance. In the past, he has also served as Deputy Head of Department of Law, Admissions Tutor, Founding Director of AIIFL and Founding Director of LLM (CFL) Programme.

He has acted as reviewer for Cambridge University Press, HKU Press, Ashgate Publishing Ltd, Cavendish Publishing Ltd, Journal of Corporate Law Studies (UK), Hong Kong Law Journal, Company and Securities Law Journal (Australia), and Journal of Business Law (UK), and some universities' promotion exercises. He has also appeared in local TV interviews.

He has delivered lectures in Beijing, Taipei, Tokyo, Zurich, Melbourne, Brisbane and Okinawa, and was invited by Professor John Ruggie of Harvard University (Special Representative of the Secretary General of UN on Business and Human Rights), to speak at an Expert Consultation in Toronto in Support of the Corporate Law Tools Project of the UN Special Representative and nominated by the HK Government to speak at an APEC conference in Washington DC. He has also delivered conference papers in Shanghai, Berlin, Reading, Hong Kong, Macau, Sydney, and Singapore.

Mrs Karen Ho

Mrs Karen Ho is formerly the Deputy Principal Solicitor (Company Law Reform) of the Companies Registry, Mrs Karen Ho is now a Consultant in Company Law. Her main duty is to review and assist in any legislative amendments of the Companies Ordinance.

Professor CK Low

Professor Chee Keong Low ('CK') FCIS FCS is an Associate Professor in Corporate Law at CUHK Business School with research interests in issues pertaining to corporate governance and the regulatory framework of capital markets. His research, which has published in journals in Australasia, Europe and the United States of America, is supported by private sector grants from EY, Noble Group, Sino Group and Tricor Services.

An Advocate and Solicitor of the High Court of Malaya, CK is a member of the Securities and Futures Appeals Tribunal as well as the Process Review Panel of the Financial Reporting Council in Hong Kong. He was previously a member of the Listing Committee of The Stock Exchange of Hong Kong from May 2006 to July 2010; the Financial Reporting Review Panel from July 2007 to July 2013 and served as a Director of the Asian Institute of Finance in Malaysia for three years through April 2012.
