Greening and Its Impact to the Construction Industry

Since establishment of the Greening and Landscape Office under the Development Bureau, the government has also adopted new measures in-line with this direction, which applies to new developments both in the public and private sector.

Practical Turf Management in Hong Kong

The quality of the turf in Hong Kong Stadium has attracted much public concern recently. Quality of turf for sports ground requires high level of professionalism and expertise and both the design and the management process. The incident in July this year was an unfortunate one, but it can also serve as an opportunity for us to review in a holistic manner what the problem is and set out the strategies towards the right direction.

Dr. Eric Lee 李賢祉博士 PhD

Dr. Lee obtained his PhD from the University of California at Santa Cruz in 1973, and was a Mercer Fellow of Arnold Arboretum at the Harvard University in 1973-1975. He has been involved in nearly all the major turf projects in Hong Kong and nearby regions since the 1970s. He was acknowledged in the early 80s as the most knowledgeable turf professional in southern Asia by USGA’s official publication “Turf Management”. He has been a board member of the Chinese Turf Society; and is currently an Honorary Senior Research Fellow of the School of Life Sciences in the Chinese University of Hong Kong, and President of the Hong Kong Institute of Horticultural Science
