Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants takes regulatory action against a certified public accountant

(Hong Kong, 15 February 2016) — The Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants has undertaken regulatory action against a certified public accountant, So Kai Kuen (A19133), for his failure or neglect to observe, maintain or otherwise apply a professional standard issued by the Institute.

So is a certified public accountant who does not hold a practising certificate. As such, he is not allowed to carry on business in a name that includes the characters "CPA" or "會計師". So arranged four registrations of his business in a name that included those characters. He also placed online advertisements for promoting his services and recruiting staff under a business name that included "CPA" and "會計師".

The Institute concluded that So was in breach of section 420.3 of the Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants by his inclusion of the characters "CPA" and "會計師" in the name of his business.

Regulatory action

Based on the foregoing and in lieu of further proceedings, the Council concluded that the following Resolution should resolve the complaint:

- 1. So acknowledges the facts of the case and his non-compliance with the relevant professional standard;
- 2. So be reprimanded; and
- 3. So pay an administrative penalty of HK\$20,000 and costs of HK\$10,000.

In accordance with Council powers outlined in the Professional Accountants Ordinance and as a part of the regulatory process to handle complaints, a Resolution by Agreement (RBA) may be offered to respondents in cases considered to be moderate after taking into account factors including, but not limited to, the nature and seriousness of a complaint, past disciplinary records of the respondents and any aggravating or mitigating circumstances. An RBA will not be offered in cases involving complaints of dishonesty.
