<u>Information on the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants</u>

- The Institute is the only statutory licensing body to register and grant practising certificates to CPAs in Hong Kong
- Scope of Work
 - Registration of accountants and issue of Practising Certificates
 - Setting Codes of Ethics and Standards of Accounting and Auditing
 - Regulating the professional conduct and standards of members
 - Organising professional examinations and related counselling courses
 - Providing Continuing Education and other services to members
 - Promoting the Accountancy Profession
- Types of Membership
 - CPA, CPA (practising), FCPA, FCPA (practising) and International affiliates
- Statistics on Members (as at 30 June 2011)
 - Total number of members (32,168) including:
 - CPA (27,228) & FCPA (4,940)
 - Practising certificate holders (3,827) & Non-practising certificate holders (28,341)
 - Total number of registered students (14,537)

Introduction to the Qualification Programme (QP)

- A comprehensive training programme that provides the knowledge and skills necessary to become a CPA. QP builds on an accounting degree and progresses to course work and examinations.
- Both accounting and non-accounting degree holders can join the QP.
- To develop the practical skills and personal qualities including analytical thinking, problem solving and objective judgment via workshop and practical experience components of the QP.
- QP comprises of four modules, Module A (Financial Reporting), Module B (Corporate Financing), Module C (Business Assurance) and Module D (Taxation).
- Students have to attend workshops, pass the module examinations (open book) and final examination (open book) and 3-years work experience to be qualified as CPA.
- International recognition: recognized by international accounting institutes of Australia, Canada, England and Wales, Ireland, New Zealand, Scotland, South Africa and Zimbabwe.
- HKICPA members can get four paper exemptions from PRC CPA Uniform Examination under the CEPA.
- CEF reimbursement up to \$10,000 for enrolling QP.
