



Retirement Protection Forging Ahead

The Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants continues the Current Affairs Series to promote members' awareness of important social and economic issues in Hong Kong. For the third seminar of the series, we have invited the Chief Secretary for Administration of the HKSAR government, Carrie Lam, to talk to us on the retirement protection system in Hong Kong.

In December 2015, the HKSAR government launched a six-month public engagement exercise to collect public views and feedback on Hong Kong's retirement protection system. Like many other economies, Hong Kong adopts the multi-pillar model, which is in line with the model advocated by the World Bank and comprises social security schemes, MPF, voluntary savings, family support, as well as various housing, healthcare and welfare services provided by the government. These pillars serve the needs of different groups of elderly through multiple channels built on the principle of shared responsibility. Nevertheless, it is necessary for the Hong Kong community to better prepare for the challenge of an ageing population.

In this seminar, Mrs. Lam will highlight the challenges of Hong Kong's ageing population, the proposed directions and measures to enhance the retirement protection system, their impact on public finances, as well as other relevant considerations.
