Mr Chiang was graduated with honors in a degree in Architecture from University of Hong Kong in 1980. His passion for traditional Chinese architecture has led him to study Chinese metaphysics for 30 years and eventually become a renowned expert consultant. Being the first disciple of the grand master Wang Tingse (黃亭之), Mr Chiang specializes in Fung Shui and Chinese astrology in particular "sequence of dragon - 排 and has combined his architectural knowledge with the Chinese metaphysics in his practice.

His recent works included various new town planning projects in Chen Zhou (彬州) Gui Yang country (貴陽縣) and Yu Fu City (雲浮市) in China and the AMP Millennium City in Hong Kong. He also contributed to the discovery of the ancient site of the Pagoda of Bao En Temple and the Buddhas relic in Nanjing, 2008.

He is the author of 7 popular Fung Shui books in Chinese and a regular columnist of The Economic monthly magazine.
