About the topic

At this seminar, Victor Joffe QC will give an overview of the facts of the Yung Kee case, which involved a well-known, local family restaurant business. In the light of this case, he will discuss the following :

1. Jurisdiction to order just and equitable winding up of companies registered outside Hong Kong.
2. Jurisdiction to grant unfair prejudice relief under Companies Ordinance section 168A, in respect of a company registered outside Hong Kong.
3. Unfair prejudice - an overview of the problems.
4. Does a quasi-partner have a right of veto over corporate decisions?
5. Valuation issues: Method and basis of valuation of (i) companies and (ii) properties for purposes of unfair prejudice proceedings.
