

# VAT reforms in China - The impact on multinational corporations and the future direction of the VAT programme

The first phase of the value added tax (VAT) pilot programme has been implemented nationwide in mainland China since 1 August 2013.

At this seminar, the speaker will discuss the key impacts of the VAT pilot programme for multinational companies doing business in, or with, China. He will also talk about future phases of the VAT pilot programme and what it will mean for businesses in other key sectors including financial services, insurance, real estate and construction. In addition, he will examine the impact the transition to VAT will have on pricing, overall indirect tax liabilities, changes to contracts, invoicing, and IT systems and processes which will need to be implemented in light of the reforms.
